Deborah Mcclenden 28 February 1729, Probated 1732

In the name of God amen, I Deborah Mackclenden widow of Perquimans Precinct in NC,
gong in health and perfect in memory praise to God for the same and knowing the
uncertainty of this life and desirous to settle my affairs in order doemake this my last will
& testament in manner and form following:

that to say, first I command my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be
decently buried according to the direction of my executor hereafter names ----- as
touching my worldly estate I have as followth - viz: I give an bequeath to my grandson
Joseph Sutton six pounds in good species to be paid by my executor.

Item: I give to my son Richard Whedbee all the remaining part of my estate both real &
personal be it what kind so ever & lastly I do appoint my son Richard Whedbee my sole
executor to this my last will & testament revoking all former wills by me heretofore made
acknowledging this to be my last will & testament as witness my Hand & Seal this
twenty eighth day of February 1728-1729. Deborah (O) MackClenden Her Mark
Signed sealed & pronounced in the presence of us, Charles Denman James Anderson,
Senior James Anderson, Junior

Perquimans Precinct - At a Court held October the 15th 1732, the written will was proved
by oath of James Anderson, Senior and James Anderson, Junior evidences therto who
disposes they saw Charles Denman sign the same as evident the executor being present
