THE COWARD FAMILY HISTORY

The Coward familes in America are of English ancestry. The name is spelled three different ways by different brenches of the family: Cowherd, Coward, and Cowart.

The research of family historian Joe A. Cowart, Jr., 829 Indian River Drive, Cocoa, Florida, reveals that over 95% of all the present Cowherd-Coward-Cowwart families now in the Southern United States originate from three - apparently unrelated - men:

- 1- Jemes of Rappahannock County, Virginia, through his son William.
- 2- James of old Rutherford County, NC
- 3- John Coward, Revolutionary soldier, who was born in New Jersey but settled in Jefferson County Georgia after the Revolutionary War.

Other early settlers were Richard Coward in Talbot County, Maryland and James Coward of Dorchester County, Maryland, and Hugh Coward of Monmouth County, NC. The Virginia and Kentucky lines usually spell the name Cowherd, while other lines retain the use of Coward, and some lines have changed this to Cowart.

Tradition has it that our forbear JAMES COWARD came to North Carolina from Culpeper County, Virginia. Certainly there were Cowards (Cowherds) in that area of Virginia as early as 1678. (Ref: Edythe Cowherd Newton's Cowherd Genealogy printed by Roberts & Son, Birmingham, Alabama, 1962).

There was a James Coward, along with 35 other immigrants, who came to Virginia in 1688 (Ref: Rappahannock County, Va. Order Book, 1686-1692, page 77). It is possible that he could have been the ancestor of our James Coward, It should be explained that Culpeper County was formed in 1748 from OrengeCounty; Orange County was formed in 1734 from Spotsylvania County; Spotsylvania was formed in 1720 from Essex Co., King & Queen County, and King William County; Essex Co. was formed in 1692 from Rappahannock County; Rappahannock County was formed in 1656.

Although tangible proof is lacking that our James Coward came from Culpeper County, Virginia, it is quite likely that he did, but other possibilities should be examined until positive proof is obtained.

We should consider whether or not he could have been the James Coward, gardener, age 21, who in 1774 came from Dorsetshire, England, on the ship "Chance" to Maryland. (Ref: Emigrants from England 1773-1776, transcribed by Gerald Fothergill, Port of London, 2nd to 9th January 1774, page 15.) Or perhaps he descended from the Stephen Coward who was in Charles County, Maryland as early as 1675 (Ref: Charles County, Md. Will Book 2, page 358; liber A32, ff. 21-23 Maryland Calendar of Wills, Cotton Vol. 1, page 110; also Cotton Vol. 2, page 70). Also there were Cowards in Dorchester County, Maryland at an early date.

Carolina Cradle, Settlement of the Northwest Carolina Frontier, 1747-1762, refers to James Coward as a pioneer from Charles County, Maryland.

When James Coward came to western North Carolina has not been established. He married a Miss Weaver ca. 1772, but we do not know where. Their son Jonathan Coward was born ca. 1774, and family tradition has it that he was born in Rutherford Co.

Many of those who settled the western North Carolina lands were Revolutionary soldiers, because the government gave these soldiers priority in making land grants. Lewis Smith, who came to Haywood County, is an example. He was born in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, and his family moved to Augusta County, Virginia prior to the Revolutionary War. It was here that Lewis Smith enlisted. (His Revolutionary War record is on file in National Archives.) After the war, he left Augusta County, Va. and obtained land in Haywood County; he married Mary (Polly) Wikle, and they became the forbears of many of our kin.

It is possible that James Coward could have participated in the Revolutionary War and became eligible for a land grant on the newly acquired Cherokee land in Western North Carolina. We know he was in Rutherford County in 1785 - the year a treaty was made with the Cherokee Indians - because he entered land in that county on May 10, 1785 (Ref: Secretary of State's Office, File No. 305, Grant 266, Book 65, page 321). He probably was already living there at the time he applied for a grant, and it is possible he could have been there sometime.

According to Joe A. Cowart, Jr., and other family historians, James Coward was the father of seven children:

I. JONATHAN COWARD (ca. 1774 - 1853) married Martha Hudson (in S. C.??) II. PETER COWARD (17 - 18) married 13 January 1801 in Rutherford Co. to Nancy Dimsdale.** III. SARAH COWARD (17 - 18) married 13 January 1802 to David Cockram.** IV. JAMES COWARD (1785 - 18) married 8 November 1812 to Mary Worley in Rutherford County, NC. ** V. STEPHEN COWARD (1790 - 18) married 29 November 1815 to Amelia (Millie) Rogers in Rutherford County, NC ** VI. REBECCA COWARD (17 - 18) married 13 June 1821 to Obadish Worley. ** VII. RELIHU COWARD (1793 - 18) married 27 January 1823 to Charlotte Bird.** ** Ref: Rutherford County, North Carolina, Marriage Bonds According to family tradition, Jonathan Coward and his brother Peter went from Rutherford County, North Carolina, to South Carolina on the Colonois River in what is now Pickens County. According to Linden Coward's book, Nathan Coward-Jane Rogers Family, it was here that Jonathan met and married Martha Hudson. According to his record they settled on the French Broad River for a while and later moved to Caney Fork Creek, where they lived for the remainder of their life. According to Linden Coward, Jonathan was a cooper by trade.
