Extract from Army Regulations,  
edition 1861.

Par. 190. Furloughs will be granted only by the commanding officer of the post, or the commanding officer of the regiment actually quartered with it. Furloughs may be prohibited at the discretion of the officer in command.  
Par. 191. Soldiers on furlough shall not take with them their arms or accoutrements.

1<sup>st</sup> day of August to the 26<sup>th</sup> day of August  
at which period he will rejoin his Company or regiment at Washington N. C.  
or wherever it then may be, OR BE CONSIDERED A DESERTER:

Subsistence has been furnished to said Private to the  
day of August and pay to the 26<sup>th</sup> day of  
both inclusive.

GIVEN under my hand, at Washington N. C. this 10<sup>th</sup> day  
of August 1862
